## Northern Nevada Stock Dog

Association (NNSDA) is offering a two-day herding clinic for all herding breeds and handlers, with three training options, customized for your level of knowledge and experience:

**Full (2-day) Training:** Individually customized training intended for those with beginner to advanced herding experience, the trainer will work with you and your dog (at least twice each day), and offer guidance on specific areas that will help to advance and/or reinforce your skills and those of your dog. Participants will also benefit from observing other group and individual lessons, presentations, demonstrations. *The cost per dog/per person: \$125 for NNSDA Members, \$150 for Non Members*

**Evaluation:** This option is designed to introduce you and your dog to herding, to assess your dog's herding ability and potential, and offer guidance on how to proceed with training. A limited number of individual evaluations will be scheduled (depending on availability) either during the morning or afternoon sessions but participants should plan to spend the day with us. *The cost per dog/per person: \$75 for NNSDA Members, \$100 for Non Members*

**Spectator/Guest:** If you would like to join as either a Saturday or Sunday spectator, you will gain insight into various training tools and techniques, and benefit from observing individual and group lessons, presentations and demonstrations. *The cost per person (no dog): \$40 for NNSDA Members, \$65 for Non Members*

*Each option includes lunch and training materials.*

**Ian Caldicott** owns/operates Wolston Farm in Scio, Oregon, where he raises a flock of over 150 sheep and hosts numerous training events including USBCHA and AHBA trials, and the upcoming Border Collie AKC National Herding Specialty (2011). With a background in education, Ian combines his gift for teaching with his ability to recognize and work with the natural strengths and instincts of each individual breed. While many clinics focus on teaching specific training techniques, Ian will focus mainly on the mental side of training your dog and teaching you the correct attitude and bearing needed to get the most out of any and all techniques and tools you may use. Ian will also be bringing some of his new puppies from his working dogs (Bear X Kate). If you're looking for a new addition, these dogs have the bloodlines to make your chores much easier.
